

# Building our Future Together

# The Background

For 46 years, The Thompson has served thousands of older adults and their families with nutritious meals, transportation to appointments, wellness classes, vaccinations, tax preparation, caregiver support groups, medical equipment, social events, homesharing, creative arts series and so many more programs.

Our Meals on Wheels and in-house meal service have increased over 200% in the last decade. We welcome over 20 new participants each month and have a waiting list for many meals and programs. Recent crises like COVID and catastrophic flooding have proven that our older community members look to us to provide support.

### The Need

By 2030, the entire Baby Boomer generation will have crossed the age of 65, comprising more than 25% of the population nationally. This demographic shift presents a critical challenge both nationally and especially in Vermont, the second oldest state in the country, and greater Woodstock, whose older adults already comprise more than 20%.

An escalating demand for services in the greater Woodstock area surpasses current supply. We face a shortage of services and facilities to meet the complex needs of our aging population. With increasing longevity, many are at greater risk of outliving their financial resources, and many have little or no family in the area.

To meet the growing demand for services, The Thompson is expanding its facilities.

# The Plan

The Thompson is expanding its facilities by 5,000 square feet in order to meet the needs experienced now and projected for the future.

The expansion includes:

- A new kitchen, dining area and communal space to meet the exponential demand for meals, both on our campus and delivered to older adults in Woodstock and surrounding towns.
- Meeting, program and wellness spaces will be reconfigured and expanded to accommodate growing and evolving needs. The expansion will enable flex spaces that can accommodate the current and future need.

# The Budget and timeline

The project plan requires an investment of \$4 million.

With our builder, Estes & Gallop, and architects Jason Gaddis and Jeremiah Goulet, our renovations began in September 2024.

Completion is planned for September 2025.

# Home Repairs and Odd Jobs

Volunteers and staff can help with a variety of non-skilled, small odd jobs like putting away porch furniture and bird feeders, changing smoke detector batteries, figuring out how to check your voice mail, or even put up a Christmas tree. If it's a bigger job, we can help you find the right person or business for your need.

# Age Well Education and Outreach

Educational talks are presented on topics ranging from legal planning, fall prevention, the Smart Driver safety course, nutrition and cooking, downsizing, hospital to home transitions, advance directives, and more. Our Age Well e-newsletter is published every other month and provides readers with information on ways to age well at home and in their community through current and reliable information on health, lifestyle, diet and resources.

# Homeshare

Homesharing is a simple idea: two or more people share a home for mutual benefit. One person offers a private bedroom and shared common space in their home in exchange for rent, help around the home or a combination of the two. After conducting background and reference checks, trained Thompson staff will work to find the most compatible match possible based on mutual interests, needs, and



most compatible match possible based on mutual interests, needs, and lifestyle. There are no age or income restrictions to be eligible for the program.

Our homeshare pilot project was funded in part by a grant from the Woodstock Economic Development Commission. As of October 1, 2023, The Thompson operates as a satellite office of HomeShare Vermont.

# Program Highlights

It was a fun year with lots of programs, trips, and classes to enrich our lives. We loved all the ways we connected with our community over the year, but here are a few extra special ones:

- Many local friends brought classic cars to give rides at our 2nd annual car rides and ice cream social
- Our holiday and annual events were festive and fun. We enjoyed the Yankee Swap, Thanksgiving and Christmas holiday meals, holiday gift baskets, St. Patrick's Day lunch, Oktoberfest, Older Americans Month, Veterans Day, the Senior Center Month BBQ, and more!
- We stayed fit with Bone Builders, Tai Chi, Strength & Stretch, Yoga, and Eat Smart, Move More, Weigh Less, with virtual and in-person options for some classes.
- We got creative with ArtistTree through creative art projects with Finnie. A collaboration with the Norman Williams Public Library and a grant from the VT Arts Council brought us a creative play series that was weeks of fun and inspiring for many.
- Hundreds benefitted from the help of the AARP Tax-Aid volunteers, foot care clinics, and flu shot and Covid vaccination booster clinic.
- We enjoyed guest speaker talks, memoir and writing workshops, musical performances, and trips including fun Supper Club meet-ups, the Vermont Symphony, the Finger Lakes, and Ireland!
- Community Connections chats with our Woodstock police chief, our county sheriff, State Senator Alison Clarkson, our school district superintendent and other community leaders kept us engaged with our community.

# A message from our Treasurer


The Thompson is bustling with participation in Meals on Wheels, Aging at Home Support, Inhouse Dining, Educational, Health and Exercise programs, and more. It's my pleasure to report that the Thompson has favorable financial capacity to power the increasing demand for its offerings.

FY2024 operating revenue topped \$698,082, with local donations and community support as our primary revenue sources. The Thompson is inextricably tied to the community we serve, and we are grateful in every direction. Scrutiny of costs kept operating expenses below \$859,000 in FY2024. We incurred sizable repairs and maintenance to our aging building over the last years, to be remedied by our building renovation. We feel inflationary pressures of food, utility, and healthcare costs. In the midst, our competent, reliable, and dedicated staff is a top priority.

Our strategic plan directs a portion of endowment funds to supplement operations, a buffer against uncertainty. The endowment has grown through prudent investment management and generous bequests and planned-giving. We anticipate allocating a portion of endowment toward the building expansion, knowing we need to preserve sufficient levels for operating success--that balance is crucial.

Thompson staff work tirelessly to make every event, every day welcoming and expansive for participants. Staff is especially driven to provide continuity of services as the building construction unfolds. It's a very busy and very exciting time. Every person in the Thompson chain is a necessary link to living and aging well in our community: patrons, staff, volunteers, individual contributors, regional business sponsors, and town government. We so appreciate our history and relationships.
